Previously, to conduct any business meeting, 15% of the entire club had to be present.

	Revised to read: Bylaws may be modified with a two- thirds majority vote of all members <i>who return ballots</i> . <i>A minimum return of 15% of</i> <i>active members is required</i> <i>for the vote to be valid.</i>
